Occasionally I am asked, "What can I (we) do to strengthen our faith and help the church grow?" I've been praying about this lately and here is my reply:

THE CHURCH: BE ALL IN

Be the Church: There are many ways you can "be" the church. First, make a commitment to be more active in worship. If you normally come once a month, start with twice a month. If once a year, try once a month. The more you're present, the more exposure you and your family has to the Truth of God's Word.

Serve the Church: Serving the church doesn't always mean having to be a council member or a committee member (though we always could use more). It can be helping with one specific event, signing up to be a lay reader, watering the flowers once a week, etc. What interests you? Step up, step in, and obey Christ's teachings to serve one another.

Love the Church: Let's be honest. We could all give a little more (financially, of our time, and of our resources). When we put the love of our church ahead of everything (except our love for God), we learn to prioritize our schedules and our giving. Take time to visit an older or struggling member. Send a text, a card, or make a phone call to encourage someone.

As the body of Christ, we worship together, we grow together, and we love together. It is OUR responsibility to build up one another, to raise our children in the Christian faith, and to support the ministries and functions of our local church body.

It takes all of us to be ALL in.
