

#### **YOUR Local Missions Funds Report**

At our November Missions' Team meeting, the team voted to allocate some of our missions' funds to area and worldwide concerns.



\$1,000 was allocated towards building a kitchen at Khunyuam International Christian Church in Thailand. Several years ago, we provided financial assistance in their bathroom project. The church in Khunyuam provides ministry to the town's youth hostel, which provides lodging and ministry for 70-100 kids a year. The kids from the region attend the local youth camp

to attend school and receive the gospel. The church provides the light of Christianity to a culture predominantly Buddhist.

\$2,000 was distributed towards \$100 grocery gift cards to serve local families associated with the Holiday Helpers in Grant Park. In addition to the presents/gifts that are distributed towards the families of those in need, we will also provide one gift card to help towards groceries this Christmas.

\$1,500 was given to the Kankakee YWCA which provides low cost childcare that supports parents' abilities to work. The YWCA is in need of a new refrigerator, some office furniture, and more.

\$3,000 has been distributed to the Verhulst family to help them with a variety of bills occurred from their tragic accident.

\$175 was used to purchase the book <u>A Love Worth Giving to You</u> <u>at Christmas</u> by Max Lucado to distribute as gifts and invitations to our neighbors and friends to join us during Advent and Christmas Eve.

\$85 was used to purchase five turkey supper dinners for a family in need.



#### **Supporting St. Peter's**
