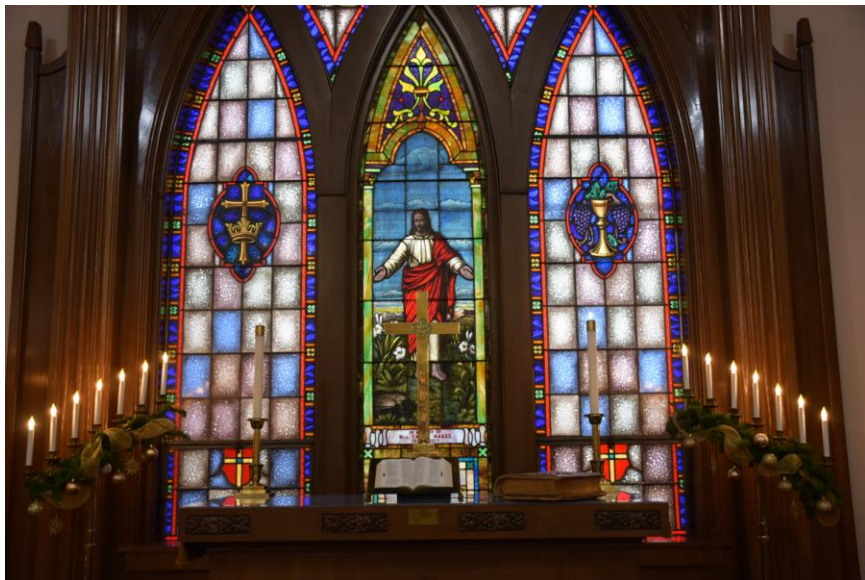

Announcements

New Year's Eve Day Worship: It will be online only. There will not be Sunday School that morning. Worship will be available on our facebook page, our church website at www.stpetersgp.org (Under Media & Sermons), and on YouTube (Search Reverend KJT for the page).

Call to the 2023 Congregational Meeting: The 2023 Congregational Meeting will be held immediately following worship on Sunday, January 22nd (back-up date is January 29th). We are still accepting nominations for council members. If you'd like to be considered, or if you'd like to nominate someone, please contact a current member of the Council and let them know.

Potato Bar Fellowship Luncheon: It will be held immediately after the congregational meeting on January 22nd. Baked Potatoes and toppings will be provided. Feel free to bring a dessert or a dish to share, or simply just join us downstairs for a time of food and fellowship.

Announcement Deadlines for Bulletins & Newsletters: Just a friendly reminder that announcements for church related functions need to be submitted to the office by Thursday, 10 am, to be included in the bulletin for that week. Newsletter items need to be submitted prior to the 25th of each month (or the Friday just before the 25th if it falls on the weekend). Adult Sunday Morning Group: Join us on Sunday mornings during the 9 am Christian Education Hour as we fellowship with one another in God's Word. The group meets in the Clyde Lange Fellowship Hall located in the basement of the church.

In January, we will explore the topic of "How to Read the Bible." We will not meet on January 1st, but we plan on gathering the other four Sundays in January.

2023 “SOUP”er Bowl of Caring Luncheon: It will be held on Sunday, February 12th, following our worship service. All donations given will go towards a local food pantry/ministry.

What is the SOUPer Bowl of Caring? It’s a fun, creative way to encourage our youth to make their own soups at home and bring them to church on Sunday to share with the congregation. Each youth is to make a crock-pot or large pot of their favorite soup. Then, they will serve someone else’s soup so that no one knows who made which soup.

Everyone is invited to try samples of as many soups as they want. They will then vote for their favorites. The winning youth will win an award. Adults are encouraged to bring their best chili to serve as well. A vote will be taken for the winner.

Stay, fellowship with one another, and enjoy raising money for a local food pantry/ministry.
